"Watch, Write and Wait"

† Proverbs 4:7 *"Wisdom is the principal thing; Therefore get wisdom. And in all your getting, get understanding"*

*I will stand my **watch** and set myself on the rampart, and watch to see what He will say to me, and what I will answer when I am corrected. Then the LORD answered me and said: "**Write** the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it. For the vision is yet for an appointed time; But at the end it will speak, and it will not lie. Though it tarries, **wait** for it; because it will surely come, It will not tarry.* Habakkuk 2:1-3

During the ministry of Jesus Christ, He invested into the lives of His disciples. His teachings transformed their lives and He commissioned them to transform the lives of others. Without proper training, it would have been difficult for them to see the vision of our Savior, run with it and wait for what He shared with them to manifest. Jesus would not physically be with them always. In John 14, Jesus said *"These things I have spoken to you while being present with you. But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things that I said to you...And now I have told you before it comes, that when it does come to pass, you may believe."* Jesus was teaching them the discipline of "Watch, Write and Wait." The lessons were learned through test and trial. Through denial, death and doubt, they came to believe. Jesus prayed *"I have manifested Your name to the men whom You have given Me out of the world. They were Yours, You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word. Now they have known that all things which You have given Me are from You. For I have given to them the words which You have given Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came forth from You; and they have believed that You sent Me....."* (Jn. 17:6-8). Where there is no vision, the people perish (Prov. 29:18a). Disciples must watch, write and wait! There are people of the world that are waiting on your vision to come to past.

Our vision is to provide a biblically-based, Christ-centered, loving environment where the members can grow in their relationship with God and understand God's plan of salvation for their lives. Our desire is that every member be committed to the greatest commandments (Matthew 22:37-39). † Romans 12:2 “... *be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God.*”

Watch: Before you write a vision, be sure that it’s a God-given vision. Watching is the season when God gives mental pictures/ prophesy of what’s to come. Habakkuk 2:1 reminds us to “*watch to see what He will say and answer when corrected.*” If the vision is blurry, ask God in faith (Jam. 1:5-6) for a clear visual. Look to Jesus for spiritual eyesight, for He is the author and finisher of our faith (Heb. 12:2). Stand still and see the Salvation of the Lord! Watch and Pray (Mk. 13:33) for the vision to come to past. Seek and He will answer (Mt. 7:7).

Write: The LORD said “*Write the vision and make it plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it*” (Hab. 2:2). Having a vision is extremely important. We have to invest quality time and effort into making the vision a reality. Taking notes on your discipleship journey is vital and that’s why God expects us to write. The Bible consists of what those before us deemed important to write for our knowledge and understanding. Providing clarity grants access to wisdom for your target audience. That’s why the Bible says to make it plain so that those who read it may run with it. You can’t expect someone to carry out a vision that lacks comprehension. If it’s a God-given vision, it’s designed to draw others closer to Him.

Wait: Be still and let God be God (Ps. 46:10). Wait patiently for Him (Ps. 37:7) to uncover the totality of the vision and you’ll discover the purpose of the vision. “*For the vision is yet for an appointed time; wait for it; because it will surely come*” (Hab. 2:3). The purpose of the vision is a reflection of what God is doing through you to build His Kingdom. To fulfill the Kingdom assignment, you must maintain a Kingdom agenda. Many of us make the mistake of releasing the vision prematurely. As a result, we reach the conclusion that the vision was not supposed to come to past or it was not supposed to come through us. Therefore, we get doubtful and discouraged. Don’t get weary (Gal. 6:9). Remember, the vision is for an appointed time! Watch God, Write the vision, and Wait patiently and passionately for manifestation.
