"Leadership Basics"

† Proverbs 4:7 *"Wisdom is the principal thing; Therefore get wisdom. And in all your getting, get understanding"*

Sometimes it's necessary to simply go back to the basics. You must remain faithful to what you have been taught from the beginning. If you do, you will remain in fellowship with the Son and with the Father (1 Jn. 2:24 NLT). It's in you! Sometimes, life can be so complicated that we compromise what we've learned. The Bible gives us such great examples to remain faithful and to remain true to the truth. Joseph's life is a testament that demonstrates what God has for you is for you. No man can curse what God has blessed. Do not judge by appearance nor make a decision based on hearsay (Is. 11:3).

Some people will hate you because of the favor that's on your life. Joseph's very own brothers hated him (Gen. 37:4). People will plot to kill you due to your God-given vision (Gen. 47:19-20). The people you least expect will come against you and sell you out (Gen. 37:27-28). People will lie on you and it will appear to be truth. Potiphar's wife lied on Joseph and had his garment (false evidence) to appear truthful (Gen. 39). You will hinder your entire team if you base your decisions on false truth (Prov. 29:12).

People will forget about you. The cupbearer forgot about Joseph (Gen. 41:9-13) BUT God remembered!! In due time, you will reap if you faint not (Gal. 6:9). Joseph didn't forget the dream that God has placed inside him. He trusted God and the dream came to past. Joseph lived with a purpose despite the obstacles. Joseph did not die in the pit or in the prison and God allowed those who sold him out to reap the rewards of his despair. Remember the dream (the vision, the purpose) that God gave to you when he called you. They plotted against you, sold you out, lied to you, lied on you, etc. *but* God used it for your good so that others may be saved (Gen. 50:20). It's all part of your purpose. Know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to *His* purpose! (Rom. 8:28). Go back to the basics. You can begin again...

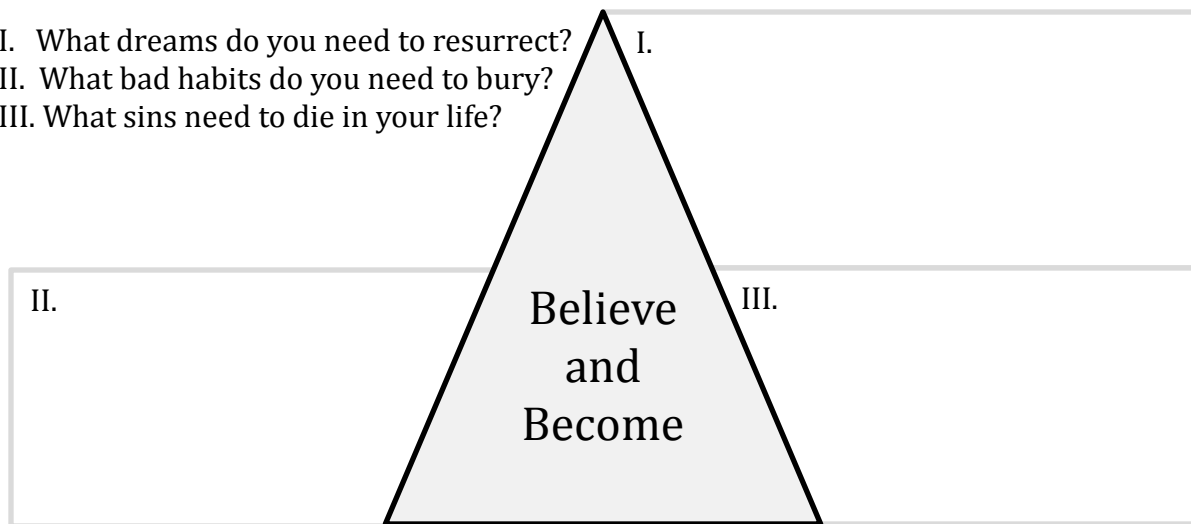
