A boot camp is established to challenge the mind, body and soul to reach its full potential. Whether it's a fitness boot camp or military boot camp, the obstacles are very intense. We become extremely engaged and excited about the results achieved. In a Bible-believing boot camp, the goal is the same. Leaders serve as a coach who thinks of creative ways to get the maximum results from those that serve in their ministry areas.
