Proverbs 4:7 *“Wisdom is the principal thing; Therefore get wisdom. And in all your getting, get understanding”*

When you’re doing things according to Biblical principles, the majority rule does not apply. There are so many examples of God doing greater with less. We can’t allow what we see to diminish God’s promise. When we do, we delay others from entering the promise land. Moses sent twelve leaders to spy the land. Ten spies failed to see the promise in the land and reported “We saw giants and we were like grasshoppers in our own sight” (Numbers 13:33). They reported what they saw with their natural eye and not what God had spoken concerning the promise. We’ll all encounter moments when what lies ahead seems too big to face. If you allow God to go before you, nothing can defeat you. Even when you feel defeated, don’t allow your feelings to defeat your belief. The Lord said “How long will you not believe me, with all the signs which I have performed amongst you?” (Numbers 14:11). Before you become, you must first believe.

Engage: Become involved and take part in the ministry.

Just as the children of Israel did (Numbers 14:1-3), we have some that assemble with us that are crying out and would rather return to the state of enslavement. When they come to church, they are often faced with two encounters: ten people gossiping about grasshoppers and only two people sharing God’s promises. This causes people to be reserved or a little hesitant about getting involved. Caleb said “Let **us** go up at once and take possession, for **we** are well able to overcome it.”(Numbers 13:30).

The bad report delayed the entrance into the promise land (Numbers 14:33-34). Are you reporting anything that could hinder anyone from entering (Luke 11:52)? _____

Endorse: Become an example and effectively advertise.

When you become a member, you automatically get an endorsement deal. Celebrities are often utilized to advertise because if you can relate to the person, you’ll recognize the product. Have you ever noticed how the advertisers strategically make the product look good to capture your attention? However, if they do anything to damage their reputation, they also lose the privilege to endorse the product. Joshua and Caleb endorsed the promise by saying “it’s an exceedingly good land!” (Numbers 14:7). The children of Israel failed to endorse so they were delayed. You are an advertiser and your reputation is a representation of your relationship with God!

Enlist: Gain the cooperation or support of others

Joshua and Caleb told the congregation “If the LORD delights in us, then He will bring us into this land *and* give it to us” (Numbers 14:8). It’s important to gain the cooperation of others because there is so much power in unity. Mark 3:25 says “if a house is divided against itself, that house cannot stand.” Joshua and Caleb had their sight on the promise. By faith, they saw what God had spoken. The ten spies had a bad report because of what they saw *in their own sight*. We walk by faith, not by sight (2 Corinthians 5:7). Faith requires action (James 2:14). Enlistment is more than just joining. It’s active duty! Faith comes by hearing (Romans 10:17), not by seeing *in your own sight*.
