“Birthing Promise”

† Proverbs 4:7 *“Wisdom is the principal thing; Therefore get wisdom. And in all your getting, get understanding”*


Are you waiting on God to fulfill a promise that He has already given you the ability to fulfill for yourself? For some, what God placed within them is full term and ready to be delivered. For others, it’s time to induce the process so you can produce the promise. Many believers remain pregnant with the hope that what God promised will eventually come to pass. There are times when we are all faced with birthing complications. A breached birth takes place when a person violates or fails to bring into fruition a promise from God. We possess the power to avoid such complications.

An Aborted Assignment occurs when a person voluntarily or deliberately terminates a God-given assignment, agreement or arrangement. In Genesis 25, we learn about the birth of Esau and Jacob. As the firstborn, Esau would inherit the family blessings from his father. However, Jacob was God’s election (Rom 9:11-12). Esau aborted his assignment by selling his birthright for a morsel of food (Heb 12:16). Due to a decision that was made in a state of weariness, the Lord said that he would demolish Esau's descendant’s attempts to rebuild (Mal 1:3-5NIV). If you have aborted the promise, it’s time to activate your faith and induce. It’s your birthright as child of God! Do not sell it due to weariness. You have a right to live victorious, be healed and be delivered (Eph 1:13-14). This week focus on the promise that God has placed inside of you and prepare to give birth. Chose Life! Miscarriage in Ministry is an unsuccessful outcome of a sinful plan or mistake from someone serving in ministry. This occurred in the life of David. God testified that David was “a man after my own heart; he will do everything I want him to do” (Acts 13:22NIV). He was anointed and the Spirit of the Lord was upon him (1 Sam 16:13). He was a man of great accomplishments but he is widely known for his relationship with Bathsheba (2 Sam 11). Uriah was loyal to David but David had him killed to cover up his sin. The child birthed through Bathsheba was not a part of God’s plan. He was conceived from sin. The mistake of one man affected his ministry. God was not pleased and the price David was forced to pay was high (2 Sam 12). David made a major mistake. He pleaded with God, fasted and worshipped. The Lord forgave him and he continued his ministry as king. Make choices that are pleasing to God!

† Romans 12:2 "... be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

Premature Promise occurs when someone attempts to fulfill the promise too early. Upon receiving salvation, we have so much zeal for the Lord. To show our appreciation, we seek to give birth to everything that *we think* the Lord has placed within us. This causes distress and major complications due to immaturity in the birthing process. During premature births, infections are bound to happen. When we expose ourselves to certain people, we get infected with fear and doubt from their negativity. The birth of Jesus demonstrates the process for birthing promises. He grew and became strong in spirit, filled with wisdom and the grace of God was upon Him (Luke 2:40). As Jesus was waiting to begin his earthly ministry, He was in the temple sitting in the midst of the teachers listening and asking questions. He was about His Father's business! (Luke 2:40-49) There will be times when you'll be misunderstood. They didn't understand Jesus either! Despite being misunderstood, Jesus increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men (Luke 2:52).
