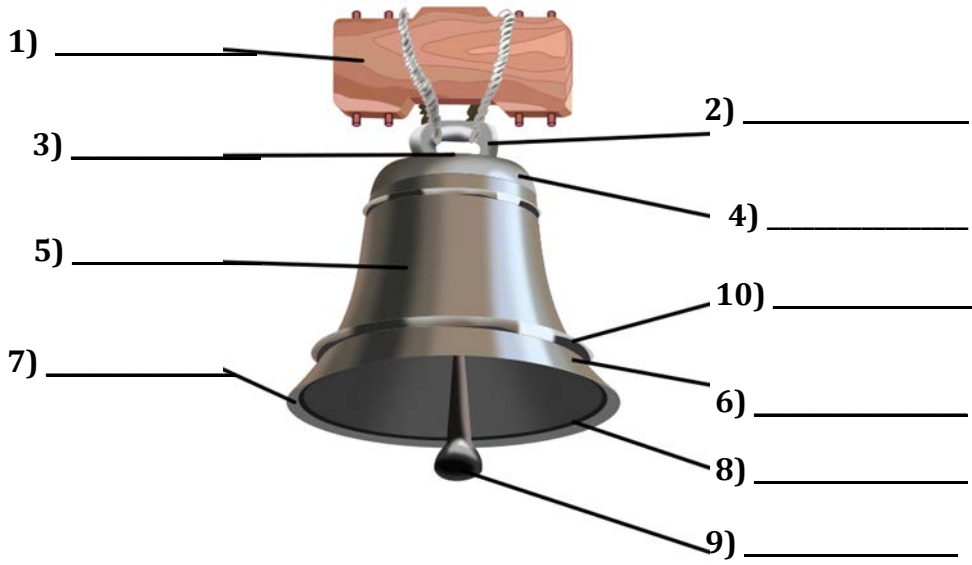

Did you know...

When William Penn created the government of Pennsylvania, he allowed citizens to take part in making laws and gave them the right to choose their own religion. The colonists were proud of this right and in 1751, when the speaker of the Pennsylvania Assembly ordered a new bell for the State House, he requested the following inscription, "Proclaim liberty throughout all the land unto all the inhabitants thereof." (Lev. 25:10). This old state house bell was originally called the "Liberty Bell" by a group trying to abolish slavery. This same group later adopted the bell as a symbol of their cause. The bell was originally cast in 1752 in London, England. The bell weighs 2,080 pounds and is 70% copper, 55% tin and small amounts of lead, silver, arsenic, zinc and gold. The bell first cracked during a test ringing soon after it arrived to Pennsylvania and was recast twice in 1753. Beginning in the late 1800s the Liberty Bell traveled around the country to expositions and fairs in an attempt to heal the divisions of the Civil War. The bell cracked again on July 8, 1835, while being rung at a funeral. By 1846 a thin crack began to affect the sound of the bell and after being rung for George Washington's birthday celebration, the bell received its fatal crack and was never rung again. In 1915, the bell made its final trip home to Pennsylvania where it remains till this day reminding the world of the power of liberty.
